Tremendous Progress on Construction, Despite Rainy Season

The shell of the first three buildings makes a solid impression. All of the walls have additional steel supports due to the earth-

quake risk. By the end of March all of the roofs will be on. Work will begin on the bed storage unit next.

Finished So Fast!

On November 14 work started and now all 18 terraces of the amphitheater are complete thanks to the efforts of over 700 volunteers. As soon as the stage and toilet block are finished, the amphitheater will be dedicated. Many a person in the USA has spent €36,000 to renovate his patio.

The same sum was sufficient to erect the open-air theater with 3,000 seats. The "Jesus.de" website largely financed the project. Now we can offer a program of hope in an area of hopelessness.

Urgent and Important

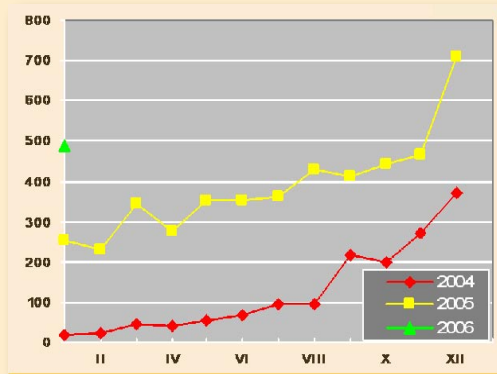
We are looking for someone who has a love for detail to help us keep a record of item donations and help pack containers, preferably a retired doctor or nurse.

Financial Gifts - Now or Never

In 2005 Diospi Suyana received 4,633 gifts totaling \$ 720,000 (plus item donations).

This adds up to US\$ 1,548,500 between fall 2003 and March 8, 2006 for the hospital project. The diagram on the left shows the number of financial gifts per month for 2004, 2005 and 2006. This sum is made up as follows:

1.136.500 USD for construction
 170.000 USD for the foundation
 60.000 USD for the plans
 30.000 USD for the plot of land
 152.000 USD miscellaneous

= 1.548.500 USD

By April 40% of construction costs will be met. **From now on, monthly financial gifts directly determine building progress on the hospital.**

What can we expect in 2006?

By the end of the year construction will be essentially complete. This requires finances of at least 1 million US\$.

Dr. Klaus John will be traveling in Germany and the USA for five months to solicit financial support. At the same time, the first 15 volunteer members of staff will be preparing to leave for Peru.

The list of equipment needs completing, then it will be time to transport the container to South America. We will have to use all our contacts to make sure that nothing gets lost in the bureaucratic labyrinth of customs. We are convinced that the power of prayer will see us through.
